Factors Affecting the Delay Seeking Treatment of Cervical Cancer's Patient to Health Services in The Central Hospital H.Adam Malik, Medan - Indonesia

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Abstract

Background. Cervical cancer is one of serious health problems. It was noted as major cause of deaths, both in the world and in Indonesia. The high mortality from cervical cancer associated with delays of patients in receiving treatment and 60-70 % of them initially diagnosed with advanced stage. In Dr H.Adam Malik, 65.5% patients received treatment at stage IIb - IVb stage in 2011. **Method.** This study was conducted to determine the factors that affect the delay of cervical cancer patients come to health services. Analytical survey research design types was cross sectional study, using primary and secondary data and analyzed in bivariate and multivariate logistic regression multiple. Population/sample in a study were women who came to the hospital H.Adam Malik were diagnosed with cervical cancer stage IIA and above and less than stage IIA in July to October 2013, with a non-probability sampling quota sampling technique, and the sample size of respondents were 169 person. **Result findings.** Respondents in seeking treatment for health services generally have an advanced stage (67.5%), respondent characteristics: age > 40 years (58%), low education level (34.3%), having more than 2 children (77.5%), lower socioeconomic (37.3%), having a family history of cancer (39.1%). Through the chi square test with p values of <0.05, no effect of: age > 40 years old p-value < 0.01, RP = 3.03 (95 % CI :1.91 - 4.30), low educational value of p < 0.01 ; RP = 1.49 (95 % CI :1.23 - 1.80), having more than 2 children with a value of p < 0.05, RP = 1.45 (95 % CI :1.04 - 4.04), low socioeconomic, p-value < 0.01 ; RP = 00:16 (95 % CI :0.09 - 0.28) is a protective factor, family history of cancer with p < 0.01, RP = 1:40 (95 % CI :1.15 - 1.71), cancer fatalism with p < 0.01 ; RP = 3.95 (95 % CI :2.65 - 5.90), poor knowledge of the value of p < 0.01, RP = 1.94 (95 % CI :1.48 - 2.56), family support with p < 0.01 ; RP = 2.57 (95 % CI :1.98 - 3.33), but there is no reference to the influence of post-examination by midwife with IVA cervical cancer patients to delay seeking treatment for health care because the value of p > 0.05. Through logistic regression testing the most dominant variable affecting the cervical cancer patients delay in seeking treatment for Cancer fatalism health care is high, low socio-economic and high parity. **Conclusion.** It is important for healthcare professional to improve patients or vulnerable persons' awareness to perform early detection through IVA test or screening, by involving community and religious leaders and NGOs.
